Example Answer

That fact that Peter does not rush to save Michael	1
makes it seem that he does not care much if Michael falls into the sea.	1
The pleasure that Peter takes in exercising his cleverness, and showing it off,	1
seems to outweigh the need to save a child's life.	1

Guidance

Make sure you include *two* points from paragraph 7. You also need to think about *why* Peter does not rush, and what 'ingenuity' means (cleverness).

Marking

To earn the 2 marks for each thing Wendy dislikes, you need to explain them both fully, as in the Example Answer, showing that you understand what is implied (suggested) by Peter not hurrying, and what his being interested in his own 'ingenuity' means.

You would not earn full marks by simply saying, 'He does not rush to save Michael. He likes to show off.' This is not a full explanation.

Top Tip

Think about implied meaning – the reasons behind Peter's actions – rather than just the very obvious.
