**Guidance**

Read the lines indicated and look for phrases that show the positive impression made on John. Then embed them in sentences of your own, as in the Example Answer. Alternatively, you could put the information into your own words.

The phrases suggesting John's positive impression include points you may have made in Q8b about the scroll (the carved curly section on the neck of the violin) and the varnish. However, as there are four other points to choose from (including that John thinks it is a 'masterpiece'), it is safer to choose from those.

**Marking**

There are 3 marks available. To earn them all you must find three different pieces of evidence that the violin has made a positive impression on John, and either embed them in your own sentences, or paraphrase them.

**Top Tip**

The phrase 'how you know' in the question tells you that you need to look at the author's language closely and decide which specific words and phrases provide evidence that the violin has made a positive impression on John.
